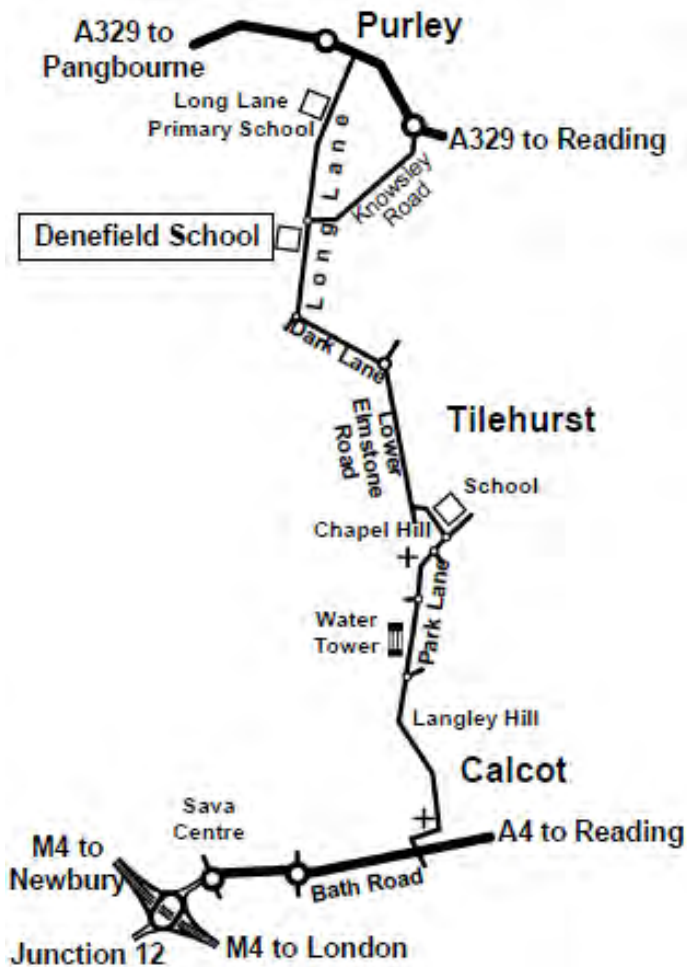
1. Let the little children come to me – questions around raising children and their role in the family.

Reading Family Day - Directions



From M4 Junction 12

Take the A4 towards Reading
At roundabout (Sava Centre), go straight on
At roundabout, go straight on
At traffic lights, turn left (Tilehurst), and go up Langley Hill
At mini-roundabout, go straight on, past water tower on left (Park Lane)
At mini-roundabout, go straight on
At mini-roundabout, go straight on
At mini-roundabout, turn left (Chapel Hill)
At T-junction, turn right (Lower Elmstone Road)
At roundabout, turn left (Dark Lane)
At roundabout, turn right (Long Lane)
Denefield School is on the left.

Total distance from M4 Junction 12 is 3½ miles

From A329 (road from Oxford to Reading via Pangbourne)

At Purley traffic lights, turn right (Long Lane), past Long Lane Primary School on right
At mini-roundabout, go straight on
Denefield School is on the right.

Total distance from Purley is ½ mile
